
# **Volunteers Needed for PAC Hot Lunch Program**

### Safety Patrollers are Trained and Ready to Go!


Though it took us a bit longer than usual to get organized and trained this fall, our new team of Safety Patrollers are ready to go! You will notice two students monitoring and directing pedestrian traffic in the crosswalk at the end of the day. These grade 5 and 6 student leaders have volunteered to help younger students and parents get safely across the street and would appreciate the help and support from parents in helping them do their job safely. Here are a few things to keep in mind to help the Safety Patrollers do their best work:

- PLEASE model using the designated crosswalk to cross the street if you are picking up your child and need to get to your vehicle on the other side of the road. Though it may be a bit out of your way, it is important that children see that a crosswalk is a safe and visible place to cross the street, especially if they are not with an adult.
- DO NOT cross between buses! Though adults can manage this type of
  maneuver, we don't want to model this as a strategy for children to copy.
  Crossing between parked vehicles is extremely dangerous as oncoming
  traffic does not have time to notice someone emerging from between parked
  cars/buses, and children often do not think about checking both ways before
  possibly running out from between the vehicles.
- When you approach the crosswalk with your child, please stop and wait for the patroller to say "proceed" before you begin to walk across with your



child. The patrollers are trained to go through a number of steps to make sure traffic is stopped and that they have checked both directions. This may take a few extra moments, and it may even seem unnecessary if you can see the "coast is clear" but please be patient as the students are just following the correct procedure, and we want them to do their jobs correctly to keep kids safe.

• Talk to your child about these same considerations - using the designated crosswalk, not crossing between buses or cars, and waiting for the patroller to say the words "proceed" before starting to cross the road.

#### **Protect Your Family with Student Accident Insurance**



We all know that accidents can, and do, happen. While your provincial coverage or your employee benefits plan may cover some medical, dental or other expenses related to these accidents, they may not cover all of them. Student Accident Insurance helps to protect your family from these unexpected costs if your child is injured on school property or during school-sponsored activities.

The Wild Rose Board of Education provides automatic blanket student accident coverage for all students registered with our school division. This coverage is funded by the Board for those additional insurance needs that can result from a student accident.

Student Accident Insurance provides a <u>recovery</u> option for <u>extra</u> costs associated with a student accident. Examples of more common types of coverage would be for eyeglasses, ambulance costs, or dental coverage. Please note that the parent must pay for the expense of the medical requirement and then request reimbursement utilizing the claimant form. Please ask the school for the claimant form should a student accident occur that results in additional costs.


Coverage is **available in three affordable plan options**, for as low as \$17/year (that's just over 4 cents a day!) in Lite, Plus and Premium. Benefits include:

- Dental treatment
- Damage to eyeglasses or contact lenses
- Ambulance transportation
- Braces, casts, crutches, hearing aids, prosthetics and splints
- Counseling, physiotherapy and tutoring
- Prescription drugs
- Accidental death, total and permanent disability
- **NEW!** Hospital cash allowance for costs associated with extended hospital stays such as parking, television or Wi-Fi in your room, parking, cafeteria meals or babysitting expenses for family members.

#### **Parent-Teacher Conferences This November**



Typically, our school does "touch base" parent-teacher conferences about a **month before our first report card**. This gives teachers a chance to meet with parents to discuss their observations, as well as areas of strength and growth, for their child, before the first report card comes out. The intent of these "pre-report card" conferences is to **give parents a snapshot of what teachers are noticing so far** in regards to their child's progress. This allows for collaboration around support strategies and also prevents any "surprises" on the first report card.

While in the past (pre-Covid) we had these interviews in mid to late October, we have been noticing that it has been taking students longer to settle in, get used to routines, establish what previous knowledge is present and then finally start learning new concepts. So we once again have **decided to host these conferences in early November - Monday**, **November 6 and Tuesday, November 7**. By this point students are settled and there has been time to start making real progress in new learning outcomes. **Areas of strength and growth** can be identified, as well as discussion on **ways parents can support their child**. This allows another month of learning and support before the first report card comes out in early December.

Conferences will be **offered in 2 formats - in person or by phone**. All interviews, regardless of format, are **booked online through our School Interview Services site**. A note with instructions on when/how to do this will be sent home later this month.

### No Drop Off in Bus Lanes OR Parking Lot Please!



We are still experiencing some confusion about where kids can be dropped off for school in the mornings. **Please read the following carefully!** 

\*\*\*The **bus loading/unloading zone** is located along the front sidewalk of the school between the crosswalk all the way to the museum. **DO NOT USE THE BUS AREA TO DROP OFF YOUR CHILD, EVEN IF THERE ARE NO BUSES PRESENTLY IN THAT ZONE!** This area is off limits to vehicles in the morning.

If you are dropping off your child, **please pull up along the curb in front of the school**, or you can stop on the other side of the street and your child can cross in the designated crosswalk area.

Also **PLEASE DO NOT PULL INTO THE PARKING LOT TO DROP OFF YOUR CHILD - THIS IS NOT A DROP OFF ZONE!** Please drop off your child in front of the school.

The Family Wellness program is a voluntary program that provides emotional, behavioural and social support to students and their families. The program is free, and available to families with children aged 5 - 19 years old, who are enrolled in the Breton community schools.

The program specifically helps with student emotional regulation, connection, verbal expression and communication and skill-building, as well as provides parent support such as information, resources, and community referrals.





Good news! Our new Learning Commons Facilitator, Mrs. Shokoples, is planning on **bringing the Book Fair to Breton Elementary this fall!** 


We will **also be offering an online link** to our Book Fair, so parents can order books directly from Scholastic and still support our school library.
